Questions:

The following questions were discussed during the presentation:

1. North Carolina DOT – “Is INRIX the only vendor who has shape files?”
 - a. Stan Young – No, all three vendors have shape files available. INRIX makes a shapefile available through an ancillary product.
2. New Jersey DOT – “Does the VPP Suite show data from all three vendors or just the vendor an agency has a contract with?”
 - a. Stan Young & Michael Pack – The VPP Suite will be modified to show all three vendor's data. RITIS will also be modified to allow for all three vendor's data to be displayed at the same time. There will be three layers of data that can be turned on and off, and you will be able to drag one on top of the other.
3. MWCOCG – “Is the DUA currently available? Why do agencies need to sign DUA in July?”
 - a. Stan Young – It should be available during the week of June 30, 2014. The current coverage expires at the end of July so if agencies need data in August, 2014, it will be in the new contract and require a new DUA. Therefore, all DUAs should be completed in July.



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4. Baltimore Metropolitan Council – “Will the sub-TMC’s be standard among the vendors?”
 - a. Michael Pack – All of the specs aren’t currently available from the vendors, but each vendor will likely have a different method for georeferencing and providing sub-TMC level data. Some let the agency define the limits and some are more dynamic and based on availability of data speed deltas.

5. MWCOC – “If an MPO gets data from multiple states with different vendors how will the VPP Suite work?”
 - a. Michael Pack – Developers are still working out the details on how overlapping data from multiple vendors will be accessed and represented in various reporting tools; however, the capabilities will exist to see multi-vendor data in the suite, and all agencies will be able to share their procured data with other agencies per the terms of the DUA.

6. North Carolina DOT – “How far back will the backfill for archiving go?”
 - a. Michael Pack – This will depend on each vendor. No more information is available at this time. Any data that has already been purchased by an agency through the contract will not go away, though.
 - a. George Schoener – This question will be added to the list of questions for the vendor webcast.

7. North Carolina DOT – “What is the end date of the current VPP? And do we need two DUAs (one with vendor and one with UMD)”
 - a. Kathy Frankle – The current VPP expires July 31, 2014. Agencies will have a contract with UMD and need one common DUA with the vendors. The DUA will apply to all three vendors.
